a. Attendance policy

Online Attendance Policy for University of Justice.us

- All students are expected to attend classes and seminars in person unless otherwise specified by their professor.
- Attendance for all online courses will be monitored via the University of Justice.us Learning Management System (LMS).
- Attendance will be marked in the LMS at the beginning of each class session.
- Students are expected to attend all scheduled online classes and seminars.
- Students who are more than 15 minutes late to class will be marked as absent.
- Students who miss more than three classes in a row without prior notification will be contacted by their professor and may be subject to disciplinary action.
- Excessive absences may result in a lower course grade or failure of the course.
- Students who miss more than one class due to extenuating circumstances must notify their professor prior to the class and provide appropriate documentation.
- Students who will be absent for more than one class due to extenuating circumstances must notify their professor prior to the class and provide appropriate documentation.
- Students who will be absent for a prolonged period of time due to extenuating circumstances must notify their professor prior to the absence and provide appropriate documentation.

• The University reserves the right to modify this policy as needed.

Uniform Requirements

The University of Justice us is committed to creating a safe, inclusive, and respectful learning environment for all students, which includes enforcing a school uniform policy while on camera. This policy is designed to ensure students are dressed appropriately, no matter the occasion.

In order to comply with the University of Justice.us school uniform policy, students must adhere to the following requirements:

LAB REQUIREMENTS AND POLICIES

If the professor has an emergency He/she will inform you all and leave the lecture or close cameras for privacy.

• All faculty, staff, and students must be aware of their responsibilities during an emergency in their home or place of study.

Crime Prevention Tips:

Even though we are an online institute we still care for and provide instruction on safety measures at the University of Justice. Some Crime prevention Tips if you go out to a library to study:

- Always be aware of your surroundings.
- Avoid walking alone at night.
- Lock your doors and windows when leaving your residence.
- Report any suspicious activity to campus security.
- If you witness a crime, call 911.

Campus Security Measures:

- Call your local emergency services most services are open 24 hours
- Access school information at tour residential or if you are using public computers make sure to sign off.
- Closed web cameras used during online and offline interactions
- Lockdown protocols in case of an active shooter.
- Have a cell phone on you at all times and remember to turn it on after class before leaving any location of services.
- Emergency contact information for faculty, staff, and students must be current.
- If there is any Security awareness training for faculty, staff, and students you will receive an email with given instructions.

1. Student conduct and discipline

Code of Conduct:

- 1. Respect the rights and opinions of others
- 2. Follow instructions given by faculty and staff
- 3. Abide by all applicable laws, regulations, and policies

- 4. Respect the property of the university and others
- 5. Abstain from any activity that disrupts the educational process

The school does not have anything to do with students when students log logoff from online classes which demands cameras. The school has every right to sue any media or personnel that associate the name of the school to students' improper behavior outside of the school. Make sure you do not use the school ID or uniform with the school name on it for any improper behavior such as bully, crime, or any academic misconduct. If you are using it for educational purposes you can inform professors, registration, and admission for a final analysis if you believe it will go against the school's policies.

Disciplinary Process:

- 1. Reports of misconduct will be investigated and addressed promptly
- 2. Sanctions may be imposed, including but not limited to verbal warnings, suspension, or expulsion
- 3. All parties involved will be heard and given a chance to explain their side of the story
- 4. The decision of the disciplinary officer is final

Appeals Process:

- 1. Appeals can be made within 10 days of the disciplinary ruling
- 2. The appeal must include a written statement outlining the reasons for the appeal
- 3. The appeal will be heard by an independent panel of faculty and staff
- 4. The decision of the panel is final and cannot be overturned

Student Grievance Procedures

- 1. The University of Justice us recognizes the right of students to bring forth grievances and issues of concern while attending the University.
- 2. Students should first seek resolution to any grievance or issue through formal means, such as speaking with faculty or staff members directly or attending an open meeting with any of the admissions team.
- 3.. All formal grievances must be filed within 30 days of the incident in question.
- 4. The University will analyze coursework and schedule to find an appropriate solution and respond to the student by email within 24-72 hours.
- 5. The University will provide a written explanation of the outcome of the grievance and the reasoning for the decision.
- 6. If a student is unsatisfied with the outcome of the decision, he or she may appeal to the President of the University within 3 days of the email received with no information.
- 7. All appeals must be made in writing and include supporting documentation as needed.

8. The President will investigate the appeal and respond in writing within 3 days. The decision of the President is final.

All students are responsible for understanding and adhering to the university's code of conduct. Violations of the code of conduct will be addressed promptly and appropriately. The disciplinary process and appeals process are in place to ensure fairness and due process.

Maternity/Paternity Leave of Absence

- Students are eligible for maternity/paternity leave of absence if they have been accepted into a degree-seeking program at the University of Justice.us.
- The leave of absence may be granted for up to one year and must be requested in writing at least two months prior to the start of the semester in which the leave will begin.
- The student must provide proof of pregnancy or a copy of the birth certificate for the child.
- If the student will be the primary caregiver of the child, they will be granted a leave of absence without any effects on grades.
- If the student is not the primary caregiver of the child, they will be granted the leave by showing information that they are the guardian newborn.
- The student must notify the University of Justice.us of their intentions to return to the program upon completion of the leave.
- If the student does not return to the program upon completion of the leave, they must notify the University of Justice.us in writing and will be subject to the University's withdrawal policy.
- The University of Justice.us will not be responsible for any financial obligations incurred during the leave of absence.
- The student may also be eligible for financial aid while on leave, depending on their individual circumstances.
- The University of Justice.us reserves the right to modify or cancel this policy at any time.

Long-term Hospital Admission or Sick Leave of Absence

The University of Justice is committed to providing students with the necessary support if they need to take a leave of absence due to a medical condition. This document outlines the policies and procedures related to

taking a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence.

- The University of Justice recognizes that students may need to take a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence in order to receive medical care or treatment.
- In order to take a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence, students must submit a written request to the Office of the Dean of Students. This request must include a detailed description of the medical condition and the anticipated duration of the leave.
- Once the Office of the Dean of Students has approved the request for a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence, the student will be eligible for a range of accommodations, including but not limited to:

Access to online course materials

Flexible deadlines for assignments

Reduced course load

Extended leave of absence

- Students on a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence are expected to keep in contact with their academic advisor and instructors throughout the duration of the leave.
- Upon returning from a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence, students must provide medical documentation confirming that they are physically able to resume their studies.
- Students on a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence are not eligible for on-campus housing or meal plans.
- Students on a Hospitalized or Sick Leave of Absence may be eligible for financial assistance, depending on their individual circumstances.

Guardian of a sick family Absences Request

Being the primary caregiver for a child or spouse who is hospitalized or sick can be a difficult and stressful situation. The University of Justice is committed to supporting students in these situations by providing a leave of absence. This article provides an overview of the leave of absence policy for students who need to take time away from their studies due to a sick or hospitalized family member.

- Eligibility: To be eligible for a leave of absence due to a sick or hospitalized child or spouse, the student must be enrolled at the University of Justice and must provide evidence that they are the primary caregiver.
- Length of Leave: Leaves are granted up to a maximum of six months. If more time is needed, the student must contact the University of Justice to determine if they are eligible for an extension.
- Benefits: During a leave of absence, the student will not be responsible for any tuition or fees. The student will also be able to maintain their student status, which will allow them to continue to receive any university-funded scholarships or grants.

Extenuating Circumstances

Attendance policies are an important part of any university, but sometimes students may have extenuating circumstances that result in a late arrival. The University of Justice has recently implemented a policy to take into account these extenuating circumstances.

The University of Justice recognizes that sometimes transportation breaks, a stop by the police, overnight sickness, internet breakdowns, or family misfortune can cause students to be late for class or to miss a day. In these cases, the University has made it possible for students to provide proof of an extenuating circumstance to receive an excused absence.

The University has partnered with various companies to provide proof of extenuating circumstances. For instance, if a student was late due to a transportation issue, they may need to provide a receipt of services from the transportation company they used.

If a student was stopped by the police, they may need to provide a copy of the police report. If a student was ill overnight, they may need to provide a doctor's note following the next day. If a student had an internet breakdown, they may need to provide a call statement from their phone service provider showing the day and time of the call. Also, email the professor about the incident with the time to correlate with the documentation provided.

By providing proof of an extenuating circumstance, students can receive an excused absence from class. This policy has been implemented to ensure that students are not punished for events that are out of their control. The University of Justice is committed to ensuring that students are treated fairly and that no one is penalized for events that are beyond their control.

Court or being Summoned to appear for a case

Students Attending court or being summoned must prove to the University of Justice.us

- All students must provide written notification to the University of Justice.us at least 5 business days in advance of their scheduled court date.
- Students must inform the University of Justice.us of any changes in their court date.
- Students are required to attend all court proceedings and must be present in the courtroom during their allotted time.
- If a student is absent from court without providing prior notice or providing a valid excuse, the University of Justice.us may take disciplinary action.
- All students must follow the guidelines set out by the court and abide by all court orders.

Campus policies and procedures
