

# Admissions Policy & Eligibility Standards

UNIVERSITY OF JUSTICE (USJ) • 2026-2030 ACADEMIC QUINQUENNium

**Admissions Philosophy:** USJ seeks to identify and admit students who demonstrate not only academic potential but a profound commitment to the advancement of justice, equity, and the rule of law in a digital society.

## 1. Undergraduate Eligibility

- High School Diploma or International Baccalaureate equivalent.
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent).
- Personal Statement detailing a specific experience or motivation related to social justice.
- Letter of recommendation from a teacher, community leader, or legal professional.

## 2. Graduate & Professional Eligibility

- Accredited Bachelor's degree in law, social sciences, or related field.
- Demonstrated professional experience in advocacy, policy, or public service (for Executive tracks).
- Submission of a 'Justice Portfolio' – a curated collection of relevant work or essays.
- GRE or LSAT scores are optional but recommended for competitive scholarship tracks.

## 3. International Student Requirements

- Proof of English proficiency (TOEFL iBT 100+ or IELTS 7.5+).
- Credential Evaluation for non-US degrees via WES or equivalent.
- Verification of digital infrastructure availability (High-speed internet/Hardware).

## 4. Diversity & Inclusion Mandate

- Holistic Review: No single metric guarantees admission; context is prioritized.
- Equity Adjustments: Consideration for students from conflict zones or marginalized backgrounds.
- Zero Tolerance: Any evidence of bias or discriminatory intent in application materials leads to immediate disqualification.

## 5. Enrollment & Transfer Credit

- Maximum transfer credit: 60 credits for UG; 15 for Graduate programs.
- Prior Learning Assessment (PLA): Experience in paralegal or advocacy work may be considered for credit.
