MASTERING THE FIRST IMPRESSION

- 1 Professional Attire:** Dress formally. Your appearance should reflect your seriousness toward your education.
- 2 Communication Clarity:** Speak clearly and confidently. Avoid filler words. Prioritize English to demonstrate proficiency.
- 3 Evidence-Based Answers:** Always be ready to support your claims with documentation (I-20, transcripts, bank statements).

Executive Summary: The consular officer is looking for three things: Are you a legitimate student? Can you afford it? Do you intend to return home?

USJ INTERVIEW PANEL

PHASE I: ACADEMIC INTENT

1. Why do you wish to study in the United States rather than your home country?

Focus on the quality of USJ's curriculum, the global reputation of US higher education, and specific resources not available locally.

2. What led you to choose the University of Justice (USJ)?

Mention specific faculty names, research facilities, or the particular ranking of your chosen program at USJ.

3. Why did you choose this specific major or field of study?

Align your answer with your past academic background and your future professional aspirations. Show passion and logic.

4. How many other universities did you apply to and what was the outcome?

Be honest. Mentioning other quality schools shows you were thorough in your search and chose USJ as the best fit.

5. Where is the location of University of Justice and what do you know about that city?

Demonstrate that you have researched your new home. Mention local industry hubs if relevant to your major.

PHASE II: FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

6. Who is sponsoring your education and what is their source of income?

Be precise about your sponsor's profession and annual earnings. Transparency build's trust.

7. How do you plan to cover living expenses outside of tuition?

Show that your budget accounts for accommodation, health insurance, and personal costs.

8. If your primary source of funding is depleted, what is your secondary plan?

Discuss family assets or savings reserves. Never suggest you will rely on illegal off-campus employment.

PHASE III: ACADEMIC BACKGROUND

9. Your transcripts show a lower score in [Subject]. Can you explain this?

Take responsibility. Explain the challenge (e.g., a difficult project) and highlight how you overcame it in subsequent semesters.

10. What were your scores on standard tests like TOEFL, GRE, or SAT?

Know your numbers. These scores validate your readiness for a demanding USJ environment.

PHASE IV: PROFESSIONAL TRAJECTORY

11. What are your specific plans after completing your degree at USJ?

Emphasize your return to your home country. Mention specific companies, industries, or roles that await your skills.

12. Do you have any relatives in the United States?

Answer honestly. Consular officers already have the data. Explain clearly if they live far from the university.

13. Do you plan to work while you are a student in the US?

Mention you are aware of F1 regulations regarding on-campus work (max 20 hrs/week) but emphasize that study is your primary focus.

14. Why should we grant you a student visa above other applicants?

Summarize your dedication to your field, your preparation for USJ, and how this will transform your local community when you return.

FINAL CHECKLIST

- Valid Passport & Signed I-20 Form
- Receipt of SEVIS Fee Payment (Form I-901)
- Proof of Financial Support (3-6 months history)
- Academic Transcripts & Test Result Slips
